









Capitol Broadcasting Company (CBC) is a fourth-generation, local, family-owned corporation founded on the belief that when a community is successful, its businesses will be successful. CBC fosters this belief by catalyzing community development across the state through CBC Real Estate, and in Durham with American Tobacco Campus, American Underground and The Durham Bulls.

This report reflects the highlights of our work over the past year.

NEW, FIVE-STAR DAYCARE CENTER ARRIVES

Kate's Korner, a new, full-service day care center, debuted in February of 2023. The facility serves nearly 100 children and received its five-star rating from the state. Kate's is now one of two downtown child care centers and received statewide media coverage from WUNC and EdNC for its trailblazing work.





EXPANDING HIGH SCHOOL

Cristo Rey Research Triangle High School, based at ATC, enrolled its third class this year. Enrollment now tops **more than 200 students from across the region**. In 2024, the school will enroll its fourth class and will serve freshmen through seniors. Projected enrollment will be more than 300.







OF BROADCASTERS

Established in 1998, the Durham Bulls Explorer Post 50 is a dynamic youth television broadcasting program. Catering to individuals aged 14-20, the program is a unique gateway for hands-on experience in sports broadcasting. This year, the Explorer Post worked with 75 youth from across the region to broadcast every home game on FOX 50/WNGT, MiLB.com, and feature highlights on WRAL's news programs.





ACTIVATING VOLUNTEERS

ATC and the YMCA partnered for the first-ever Campus Volunteer Challenge. Volunteers contributed nearly 200 hours over four weeks to 15 local non-profits. In the end, ATC tenant Clorox won the challenge with the most volunteer hours. A contribution was made on their behalf to SEEDS.

BOLSTERING STARTUPS

The American Underground (AU) continues to play a leading role in supporting early-stage ventures throughout Durham and beyond. AU hosted the eighth annual Google for Startups Black Founders Exchange. Alumni companies have gone on to raise more than \$40m in venture funding and create 125+ new jobs.

AU also expanded its support beyond the for-profit sector, by providing free coworking space to non-profit employees in August, offering subsidized memberships to non-profits and local artists, and donating event space to more than a dozen local organizations.





FIERCELY LOCAL

ATC is committed to showcasing the very things that make Durham special-our local creators and tastemakers. Over the past three years,

seven new restaurants have opened on

Campus-all locally owned. In 2023 alone, Zweli's Ekhaya, Seraphine, and the Waiting Room opened on campus with great acclaim. Campus restaurants were profiled in *Ebony* and *Eater*. And we're not done. In 2024, Durham's own Honeygirl Meadery will open a taproom at ATC!





A HOME FOR MUSIC AND THE ARTS

ATC is a cultural home for Durham and the region. This year, we hosted the Beats N

Bars Festival on Campus, partnered with Duke Arts for a fall music series, and recently welcomed the Triangle Chamber Orchestra as a new tenant and performer on campus. We're proud to play host to so many great musicians and performers across the year.

ENGAGING LOCAL ARTISTS

ATC commissioned **Durham artist Kasia Konopka** to create the two pieces that now hang in the South Deck. These large-scale works of art make the experience of entering campus more welcoming and dynamic while showcasing the richness of local talent.

A beaver appeared in the Old Bull River. Nicknamed 'Barry Beaver', ATC's most celebrated—and unexpected—guest of the year was returned to a more suitable environment post-haste.
